Joe Hunter Head Men's Soccer Coach

Joe Hunter is entering his thirteenth season as the head men's soccer coach. In his nine seasons as the Gator head men's soccer coach, Hunter has amassed a record of 65-122-11. Hunter was honored as the 1997 Northern California Athletic Conference Co-Coach of the Year after his team compiled a 10-9-1 overall record, 8-6-0 in the NCAC. He has coached several All-NCAC and All-California Collegiate Athletic Association Team Members.

He is the past chair of the NCAA Division II West Region Playoff Selection Committee and is a voting member of the NCAA Division II National Soccer Committee. As a coach, Hunter maintains an "A" license for the United States Soccer Federation (USSF), the highest coaching level in the United States. He holds memberships with the USSF Coaches Association and the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA). Hunter was previously a staff member of the USSF for Region IV working with the Olympic Development Program as an evaluator and coach and served the same duties with the California Youth Soccer Association

Hunter is active within the Bay Area soccer community. He is currently working on the staff of the Novato Youth Soccer Association as a clinician and youth coach evaluator.

Hunter served as an assistant with the men's team for five seasons before taking over the reigns as head coach in 1995. During his tenure as assistant, Hunter was the primary recruiter for the men's program. He also assisted the women's program in varying capacities. Hunter came to SFSU after spending six seasons as a player and assistant coach at Sonoma State University. He was a two-time all-conference player for the Cossacks (1986-87) who also earned all-region honors as a senior. Prior to Sonoma State, Hunter earned all-conference honors twice as a junior college player at Santa Rosa Junior College.

Academically, Hunter has a bachelor's degree from Sonoma State (1987) and a master's degree from SFSU (1997). Personally, Hunter with his sons Joseph and Nathan reside in Novato. In their spare time, they enjoy camping, hiking, and biking.

Kelly Coffey Assistant Men's Soccer Coach

Kelly Coffey is in his first season as a member of the Gator men's soccer coaching staff. Coffey came to SF State this Spring from the College of Marin where he was the Head Men's Soccer Coach and an instructor in the Physical Education department since 2003. While at the College of Marin, Coffey also was the Assistant Women's Soccer Coach from 2006-07 as well as being the Head Coach of the Novato Youth Soccer Association Select Staff Coach in Novato, California.

He also has been the Cal-North State ODP Staff Coach and the Marin FC Select Staff Coach in Marin, California. Prior to taking over the Men's Soccer program at the College of Marin, Coffey was the Assistant Coach/Administrative Assistant for the Men's Soccer Program at the University of San Francisco from 2002 to 2003. Before the University of San Francisco, he was the Head Coach for the Varsity Men's Soccer Program from January 2001 to June 2001 at Quantico High School in Quantico, Virginia. From 2000 to 2001, Coffey was the Head Junior Varsity Boy's Soccer Coach at James Monroe High School in Fredericksburg, Virginia.

Coffey has a USSF National "B" license as well as an NSCAA Advanced National Diploma. He received his Bachelor's Degree from Mary Washington College in Fredericksburg, Virginia, where he was a starter for the men's soccer team for four years and was the Team Captain from 1998 to 2000. He also was the 1999 Team MVP and a two-time member of the All-Conference Team. Coffey played a key role in Mary Washington College receiving a bid for two straight years to the National Tournament including finishing third in the nation in 1997.

He also received his Master's Degree from the University of San Francisco and also has been a member of the Bay City Rovers in San Francisco from 2001-2003. Since 2003, Coffey has been a member of Club Marin, which is affiliated with the California Premier Soccer Association.

2006 Year in Review

Notre Dame de Namur 5, SF State 2 Cox Stadium • Aug. 24, 2006

The Argonauts spoiled the Gators' season home opener this afternoon with a 5-2 victory over SF State at Cox Stadium. Dylan Glass scored the Gators' only goals of the match in the second half, his first two goals of his collegiate career.

SF State 3, Dominican 0 San Rafael, Calif. • Aug. 29, 2006

SF State recorded its first shutout of the season, a 3-0 blanking of Dominican University on the road in San Rafael. Wes Whitt connected on a breakaway nine minutes later to make it 2-0 Gators. SPU's Justin Abel scored 15 minutes later to cut into the Gator lead 2-1. Then 12 minutes into the second half, Casey Poston connected on a Shawn Granger pass to seal the win for the Gators.

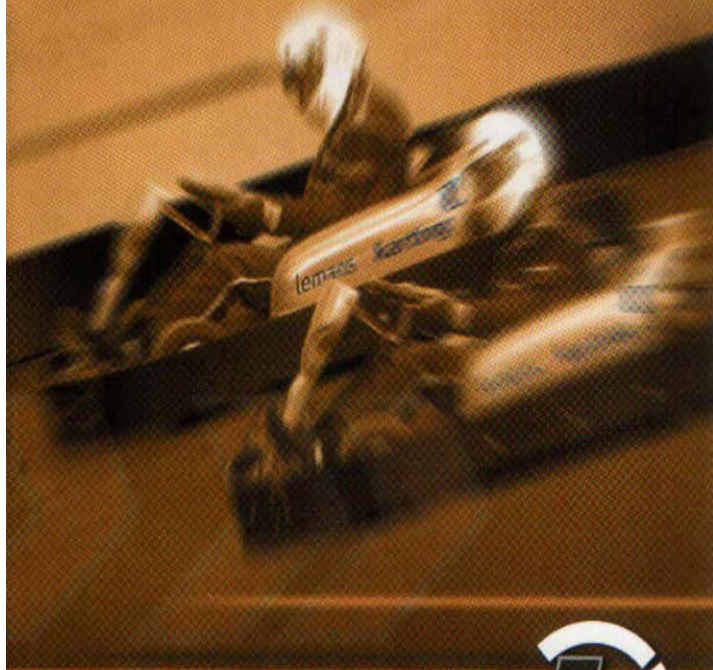

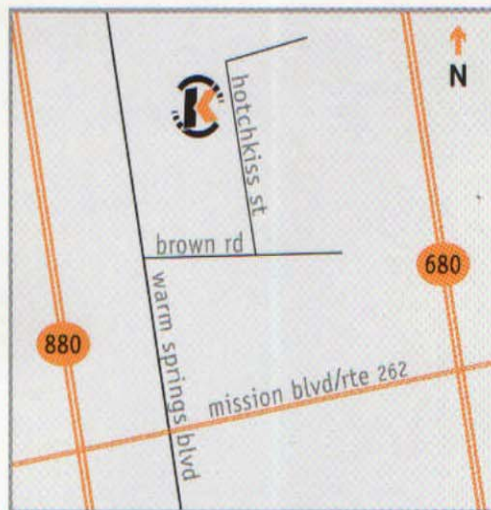
